The shootings, from February to October, ended with ten murders in the Washington, DC suburbs... terrorizing those communities and launching a massive multi-agency criminal investigation. We will explore the people, places, and events associated with this frightening assault on our domestic security.

Dr. Rublee is a retired professor of biology at UNCG. His interests and research have been in aquatic microbes, including harmful algae and the ecological role(s) of microbes in marine and freshwater systems,

Putin
